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### **AXIS OF EVIL MAPPING NEWSLETTER #6 OF 2021 – June to August**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

This edition of the Axis Newsletter keeps getting delayed. First, June pretty much shut down due to Covid health requirements; then July saw a bit of an opening up, but nothing in the way of new product arriving; in fact, 16 titles that we had sent to press were stuck in the printing process. We decided to send this newsletter out in early August, then Canada opened its land border to fully vaccinated Americans August 5<sup>th</sup>, so we decided to wait a few days to see whether this event would cause any difficulties. There have been none to date. Now, we are delaying releasing this newsletter for a further week, as 5 newly printed titles have arrived in our warehouse as I write, so we want to include them with this edition. Details are below.

#### **WARNING!**

**One side effect of the Covid era that everyone is noticing is disrupted economic supply lines. ITMB had 16 map titles at press; 5 finally cleared Customs in Vancouver, with the others held at press. Everything seems in disarray these days, as demand for paper, press time, shipping, and administration are taking longer than normal to complete. Can't do a thing about it, so please be patient if a few of our 500+ titles don't arrive right now. This is life in the era of Covid!**

#### **ACTUAL TRAVEL!!!**

Finally! Covid has receded (in my opinion) to the point where we feel comfortable booking a cruise for October. This will be on Norwegian Lines, to the Greek Islands, starting from Athens, for a week in mid-October just prior to the Frankfurt Book Fair. That's the second bit of good news! FBF is back with an on-site trade show October 20-24 and ITMB has booked a stand. We are working on an assumption that, by October, enough people will have been vaccinated in Europe to make such a trip feasible. If reality shifts and prevents such a trip, so be it, but we'll cross that bridge when we come to it. This will be our first international trip in two years, and we're excited.

#### **VIRTUAL TRAVEL: POLAND**

Although travel restrictions are in the process of being removed for North Americans, Covid restrictions still apply for international travel to Europe, as they do for anyone visiting the USA. CDC advisories notwithstanding, governments around the world will be overly cautious in opening their borders to foreign visitors. That said, this month I wish to take a virtual visit to Poland, a lovely country I have enjoyed seeing on several past trips to Europe. On this occasion, however, I wish to concentrate on a little-understood tragedy related to World War 2. Poland suffered grievously by being invaded by both Germany and Russia in 1939. It was soon overrun and as a result suffered from a brutal occupier's boot longer than any other part of Europe. At the end of the fighting in 1945, Russian troops liberated several concentration camps run by German forces, most notably Auschwitz-Birkenau, a death camp where millions were killed. The camp remains today as a modern-day museum to inhumanity, and can be visited. It is not a happy place, but travel includes bearing witness to atrocities as well as to enjoyable castles, gardens, and memorials.

Auschwitz is well-known, so my story relates to a little-known aspect of the genocidal atrocities that took place there. In April, 1942, Slovakian Jewish males were ordered to report to assemble in certain centres for transportation to 'work camps' that Germany had opened. One such man was Lala Sokolou, a well-educated young man who found himself in the hell-hole of Auschwitz that April. He was put to work tattooing arrivals with identification numbers after receiving his own number of 32407. He survived as the Tattooist of Auschwitz until the final days of the war, witnessing countless atrocities, the building of five crematoria, and the activities of other prisoners forced to do unspeakable things to those selected to die.

As Russian forces approached western Poland, the German guards fled westwards, abandoning the camp. Sokolou was then imprisoned by the Russians and forced to work as a translator until, in the confusion of the last days of fighting, he escaped and returned to Bratislava, where he was reunited with his wife, who had worked at Auschwitz sorting clothes seized from arriving prisoners.

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They eventually immigrated to Australia, which to them was as far as physically possible to place themselves away from horrible memories. Like many death camp survivors, he found it impossible to talk about his experiences until shortly before he died, when he opened up and revealed his personal encounter with horror. Auschwitz is not one of the nice places in Europe to visit, but it is part of our history. If we do not remember, we are doomed to repeat. If we do not visit the battlefields of Flanders, or the landing areas of Normandy, we forget the sacrifices made by brave people who died so that we could be free. Similarly, it is important to visit Auschwitz at least once, if for no other reason than to acknowledge that atrocities were committed by brutal and corrupt individuals following an insane political philosophy determined to racially purify Europe by murdering millions of people.

### **BLACK DEATH**

In the era of Covid, it is useful to remember that we are living through the most recent of a series of pandemics. The worst epidemic in recorded history was known as The Black Death (1347-1351), caused by bacteria from fleas transferring to humans and then by aerial transmission (much like Covid) from human to human. The incubation period was very short, and the disease manifested itself by inflaming the lymph glands with black pustules, or buboes, leading to death within a few days in most cases. The disease originated in what would be China today and spread slowly westwards, arriving in the Crimea in 1347. It spread rapidly through Europe from port city to port city, transmitted by travellers. The rats carrying the fleas were not diseased or infected, but sanitary conditions at that time period were generally weak to non-existent. Rats were commonplace, and fleas easily jumped to humans, resulting in tens of millions of casualties. The plague reached England in June, 1348, and spread rapidly through the entire island, lasting until 1359. Of course, there were no anti-biotics or vaccines in those days, and medical science was in its infancy, but measures we take for granted in 2021, such as self-isolation, social distancing, body washing, and mask-wearing were commonly used public health measures in medieval times. The difference now is that we have the benefit of a well-developed medical framework. No one knows how many Europeans died during this first onslaught of Bubonic plague, but Encyclopedia Britannica estimates that up to 60% of the total population died horrible deaths. The disease still exists to this day, by the way, but can be treated if diagnosed in time.

### **EVENTS UNFOLDING IN CHINA**

Travel to China is slowly re-opening, but politically the country is becoming increasingly reactionary. Allegations of human rights abuses against Muslims are becoming more strident and China's repeated denials are getting hard to believe, especially in the face of security crackdowns in Hong Kong Tibet, and the far west of the country. A recent survey showed that 69,000,000 Chinese, largely from Hong Kong, are considering immigrating to Canada. This is almost twice as many people as live in Canada, and it is utterly impossible for Canada to accept so many people, even over an extended period of time (Canada accepts about 400,000 new arrivals each year). The Number One destination of choice for those hoping to leave China is Richmond, British Columbia – a city of just 200,000 people. The mind boggles at the concept of so many people wanting to live in one community. This is not just idle speculation. In 2020, Hong Kong residents transferred 40 billion dollars to Canada. Further repressive moves by the Chinese government could easily lead to mass migration, however, and the world needs to watch what happens closely to avoid a rapid exodus of hundreds of thousands of well-educated HK residents. It has happened before, in 1997. Many HK residents also hold dual Canadian citizenship, so the disruptions caused by the mass exodus of 1997 could well be repeated in 2021.

### **THE USA AND RESETTLEMENT**

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The United States has a long history of resettling groups of people who risk potential persecution for supporting America during its overseas military adventures. It is called 'a moral imperative' to enable those most supportive of the USA to re-settle in America if America withdraws from a conflict. This has happened several times in recent American history, probably most notably in resettling hundreds of thousands of Vietnamese after the overthrow of the government of South Vietnam in 1975, but the Americans also resettled thousands of Kurdish allies as Saddam Hussein tried to wipe out Kurdish opposition to his rule, and again in Kosovo, to prevent Serbia from massacring local residents. By and large, such movements are popular within the USA, apart from the Trumpian era by refusing to help all Syrian and Kurdish allies along the Turkish border with Syria. Now the USA faces a crisis of having to withdraw all of its forces from Afghanistan by the end of August, if not sooner. I am not arguing that they should not do so, but the moral imperative applies to those Afghans who trusted the Americans and worked closely with them. As part of their rapid withdrawal process, thousands of Afghans, generally well-educated and intelligent, are being moved to processing centres in American-controlled bases for resettlement. This is merely the latest in a long line of assistance to those supporting American goals, and no matter how one feels about whether or not America is justified in intervening in overseas conflicts, the USA is one of the few countries in the world that accepts responsibility for those directly impacted by its overseas adventures. It has only been a few months since Trump was defeated, and already the USA is showing the traditional moral leadership that we have taken for granted traditionally. Congratulations! Biden has used his Presidential authority to allocate \$100,000,000 for this effort. What a difference! Canada has also announced that it will accept 20,000 Afghans, assuming that the new Taliban regime allows anyone to leave the country. Thus, Afghanistan enters a new phase of its long turbulent history. The immediate news impression is one that focusses on the somewhat chaotic task of flying out tens of thousands of desperate civilians at a time when Afghanistan has no effective government. While this makes the job more challenging, the Americans, assisted by allied forces from several countries, are doing a marvelous job of helping. It may not be perfect, but humanitarian efforts are far better than continuing a war that had no end.

### **ITMB IS NOW FULLY VACCINATED**

We are pleased to announce that ITMB Publishing is a fully-vaccinated company. All staff have received two doses of vaccine against Covid (usually Pfizer). We also insist that anyone entering our business premises wears a mask, whether they claim to have been vaccinated or not. We still have two grandchildren under the age of 12 who are often running around the store, and we want to protect them. Covid appears to be reducing its grip on British Columbia, but new cases among unvaccinated individuals is still a concern. 78% of BCers have had their first dose, a very high figure, and over half their second dose. This will accelerate to over 80% in the weeks to come.

### **WORK IN PROGRESS - all sellers/librarians please note**

ITMB, as of July, 2021, has ample inventory of almost all of the titles traditionally carried as part of our publishing line. We have 14 titles at press, but printers are suffering from a lack of paper, thanks to Covid health shutdowns during 2020/21, and shipping space limitations. We ask for your understanding if a particular title happens to be unavailable in the short term. Generally, we have ample inventory. The following titles are under development:

**Arizona/New Mexico** – sales are rising rapidly for this title and supplies are low. Lan has updated the artwork, which is now at press and expected quite soon.

**Austria** – This is a project that has been years in the making. ITMB introduced a single-sided map of Austria a few years ago, which sold, but did not do justice to an important country like Austria. As a result, we have re-worked the artwork into a double-sided map of the country and made it into a Rail/Road map. The artwork is almost ready to go to press, but call it a work in progress for now. It should arrive in the summer months.

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**British Columbia: North Half** – BC is as large as the USA west of the Rockies, or all of Western Europe, but the northern half of this vast province is lightly populated and poorly mapped. It is, however, a very attractive touristic destination, if for no other reason than the fact that access to the Yukon, Alaska, and the Northwest Territories are accessed through northern BC. ITMB produced a very successful detailed map of the southern half of BC a couple of years ago. Covid has provided the opportunity to prepare an equally detailed maps of the northern half of this marvelous province. The line work is approaching completion, so it will still take several months to complete this map.

**Cape Town and the Garden Route** – This is a title we have wanted to do for years. South Africa, as a country, has stumbled badly since ZANU took over the reins of power. However, things seem to be getting better touristically, so we have started developing a new double-sided map of one of the most touristic parts of all of Africa. The city side artwork is almost completed, and we are working on the southern coastline of South Africa at the moment.

**Florence and Northeastern Italy** – One of the most-visited cities in Europe is Florence. This second edition map is being developed as a double-sided city and regional map covering all of Tuscany and surrounding provinces. The city itself needs no introduction to map sellers, so all I'll say is that it covers the urban area in excellent detail at an incredible 1:5,000 scale, showing all attractions. The regional side is still a work in progress, but by its name, should cover from Venice to Milan to below Sienna.

**Georgia and Tbilisi** – The Caucasus region has been volatile ever since the breakup of the Soviet Union in 1989. ITMB first published a map of the Caucasus region in the mid-1990s, noting various breakaway mini-states/autonomous regions and the fracturing of the region into mutually hostile nation states. As a result, it is very difficult to map a country like Georgia accurately. How does one portray the various autonomous regions? What is the correct border between Georgia and its neighbouring states? How can one prepare a map of Georgia without including parts of Russia, Turkey, and Azerbaijan? One might as well ask 'What is the sound of one hand clapping?' The time has come to prepare a detailed map of Georgia as it is today without unduly combining it with artwork covering neighbouring states as an integral part of the artwork. Thus, Lan is working on a detailed map of the country on one side, and a first-ever detailed map of Tbilisi on the second side. ITMB publishes an excellent map of Georgia combined with Armenia, which is available. We are not expecting Georgia to be completed during the summer.

**Grand Canyon** – sales are rising rapidly for this title. Lan has updated the artwork, and a new edition is at press, expected soon.

**Mexico: Chihuahua & Coahuila States** – We are out of stock of this title, so are preparing a fresh edition. I have proofed the line work, so it is well-developed, but not ETA.

**Mississippi River** – From its acquisition from the French of the Louisiana Purchase, Old Miss has been pivotal to American historical development. This new map focuses on the states bordering the giant river, from its initiation with the Missouri to its mouth in the delta south of New Orleans.

**New Orleans** – We are just beginning our map of this important travel destination map, so it will be several months before the artwork will approach completion. It will then form one side of a double-sided map, with a map of the Mississippi River watershed gracing the other side.

**Persian Gulf Cruising** – I'm not sure if this is what the final title will be, but work is well-advanced on a map of the Persian Gulf/Arabian Sea region, with a focus on regional tourism via cruise ship travel, and I can't see us being politically correct and calling the body of water anything except its proper place name, even if Persia disappeared many years ago. I refuse to name it Iranian Cruising!

**Queensland (Australia) double-sided map** – as our data base develops for Australia, we are finally able to provide detailed travel maps for most of the states of Australia. South Australia and Northern Territory have already been released, as has Western Australia. Now it is Queensland's turn. The line work is complete and the artwork has received its initial proofing; no ETA at the moment.

**Russia's Heritage Cities** – The current edition is out of inventory and consideration of a fresh edition suspended until travel to the central portion of Russia is more safely accomplished.

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**USA Pacific Coast** – sales are recovering quickly for this title and we are running short of inventory. Lan has updated the artwork ; no ETA at the moment.

**Wales and Cardiff** – Lan is working on a more detailed map of Wales than we have been able to produce to date. I've reviewed the artwork, and it looks pretty good. The reverse side will be a detailed map of Cardiff, the nation's capital, which I haven't yet seen. No idea when this project will be completed!

**Amsterdam & Netherlands 2<sup>nd</sup> Ed. 2021 1:8,000/1:400,000 on waterproof paper ISBN 9781771290197 UPC 817712901972 \$13.95cdn/us E9.50 8.95GBP** – As a result of Covid-related shutdowns, we have been able to concentrate on our backlog of titles needing to be done but for which time seems to be denied. Amsterdam is such a title. The city is one of the major gateways into Europe and the touristic value is very high. The coverage goes from the Rembrandt Park in the west to the harbour in the east, and from the large Volkstuin Park in the north to below Vondels Park in the south. All the tram lines are shown, as well as rail tracks and the Metro lines, hotels, restaurants, museums, and attractions. As a bonus, we have included a list of the city's top attractions. The reverse side contains a detailed travel map of the Netherlands. By the shape of the country, this includes a portion of northern Belgium as far south as Brussels. Due to the rather densely populated nature of the country, our ability to show historic sites and attractions has been somewhat limited, but we are doing something on this map that I've never seen on any other map – showing all the windmills that are so closely related to the Dutch heritage! All the motorways and main highways are shown, of course, and we have included a list of top attractions. The map is printed on waterproof stone paper for durability and is biodegradable. **AVAILABLE**

**Balkans and Peaks Travel Reference Map 1<sup>st</sup> Ed. 2021 1:2,750,000/1:55,000 ISBN 9781771291026 UPC 817712910264 \$13.95cdn/us E9.50 8.95GBP** – The portion of Europe east of the Adriatic and west of the Black Sea and south of the Alps has traditionally formed the region known as the Balkan States. This includes the former Yugoslavian states of Slovenia, Slovakia, Croatia, Montenegro, Bosnia Herzegovina, Kosovo, Serbia, and Northern Macedonia, as well as Albania, Hungary, Romania, and Bulgaria. Due to its shape, a large portion of Greece, and a bit of Turkey also are included. This is a new area of mapping for us, resulting from numerous visits to the region. It is essentially a road map, as the rail network is weak, although rail lines carrying passengers are shown. Nice though the regional map is, its strength lies in the hiking map of the Peaks of the Balkans on the other side. This detailed map is centred on eastern Montenegro, northern Albania, and western Kosovo. The ten major hiking routes are shown in pink, and there are numerous secondary routes one can explore. This is a growing touristic destination for those seeking a semi-wilderness area for enjoyment, while remaining in Europe, and is becoming quite popular. Accommodations are comprehensively shown, as well as campsites. Contouring is shown, and many peaks are noted. It should be stated that, as these paths cross international borders, hikers should keep their passports handy for inspection. **AVAILABLE**

A map of all of Europe is useful, but at a scale that limits our ability to show information. As a result, last year we published a map of Western Europe. Now, we are pleased to extend our more detailed coverage of the continent with a map covering the Central European countries of Germany, Austria, Poland, Czech Republic, Hungary, Slovakia, and Switzerland, with portions of France, Belarus, Serbia, and Romania. A third map, covering eastern European countries, will be released soon, providing detailed regional coverage of the continent in a way that we hope is pleasing. Germany occupies most of the first side, and Poland the other, with Czech and Slovakia divided between the two sides, and Slovakia/Hungary filling the rest of side 2. This is a regional map, showing rail lines as well and roads, airports, and major touristic attractions. A listing of the region's top attractions is included. This map will appeal to those visiting several countries on one trip, by rail or road. **AVAILABLE**

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**Maui, Kauai, & Molokai Travel Reference Map 1<sup>st</sup> Ed. 2021:100,000 on waterproof paper 1:100,000 ISBN 9781771293396 UPC 817712933966 \$13.95cdn/us E9.50 8.96GBP** - At long last, we have finally found time to complete our detailed mapping of the American state of Hawaii. The island of Maui may not be as well-known as Oahu, which is extremely popular with Japanese honeymooners, but it is as attractive touristically. Our coverage covers most of Side 1 and includes a detailed inset map of Wailuku, the principal urban area, as well as insets of Lahaina on the west coast and Wailea resort area. This side also includes a map of the island of Lanai, with its main urban area of Lanai City as an inset. Side 2 concentrates on the islands of Molokai, Kauai, and the lightly populated island of Ni'ihau, and includes detailed inset maps of Lihue, Kaunakakai, and Po'ipu, all of which are major resort destinations. The islands are loaded with beaches and places to stay, but also with attractions, which are shown on the map. This is a beautiful map, one of the best we have ever produced, and is a fitting companion to our maps of Big Island, and Oahu/Honolulu, as well as our state map. The Maui/Kauai map also has a double-sided cover, so can be displayed as two separate maps. **AVAILABLE**

**Montana and Idaho Travel Reference Map 1<sup>st</sup> Ed. 2021 1:900,000 ISBN 9781771294751 UPC 817712947512 \$9.95cdn/us E9.50 8.95GBP** - ITMB is pleased to release two more state maps, this time of Montana on one side, and adjacent Idaho on the other side. Montana prides itself on being the 'blue sky' state. Due to its high elevation, the sky does appear to be a darker shade of blue than is common in areas closer to the ocean. The state is lightly populated, so much of its attractiveness rests with natural features, such as Glacier National Park on the Canadian border, and Yellowstone National Park on the Wyoming border. The state is also perfect camping country, and our map includes dozens of authorized campsites. It also includes the national heritage site of Little Big Horn, where Lt. Colonel Custer and the US 7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry were massacred after foolishly attacking a vastly larger encampment of Sioux and Cheyenne first nations people under the leadership of Sitting Bull. The second side of the map portrays the State of Idaho, an equally large geographic area lightly populated. The terrain is quite mountainous, but is ideal for growing potatoes. The northern portion of the state is a narrow neck used mostly to get between Washington State and Montana, but the southern half encompasses the Snake River Valley. As with Montana, outdoor recreation is the main attraction, with dozens of parks and campsites. Coeur d'Alene, the main town in the north, is actually a corruption of Coeur de Lion, named after a French Canadian fur trapper who lived in the area many years ago. The map also has two different covers, one for each state, so can be displayed in two different areas of a store. **AVAILABLE**
